2016 SUMMARY OF COCA PROGRAMS AND EVENTS

FEBRUARY 25: This year we had our first ever Meet & Greet Evening Social, which was held at the TekSolv –American Allied Safety Council training building, Collinsville, IL. Members and invited guests had an opportunity to mingle with other COCA Construction Associate members and the Owner Board of Directors and representatives of our owner companies. This event was an opportunity to network in a relaxed atmosphere without pre-planned activities.

MARCH 16: A joint meeting of COCA's Board of Directors and Construction Associates was held at the Gateway Center, Collinsville, IL. Our speakers were Mr. Terry Beach, Executive Director and Economic Development Director, St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grant Department for St. Clair County. Also speaking was Mr. Daniel Trapp, Director, Engineering and Planning, Mid-America St. Louis Airport. They spoke about the potential relocation of the National Geospatial Intelligence Agency to Illinois near Scott Air Force Base. While the final decision on site location had not been determined prior to this presentation, this \$1.6B project was believed to have the potential to have a major economic impact on the Metro East construction industry, if the Illinois site was selected, including thousands of construction jobs. He also explained how the NGA relocation could affect additional support projects while bringing up to 3000 new full time jobs to our area.

MAY 7: COCA held a Trenching & Shoring Competent Person Safety Training Program at the Ameren Illinois Service Yard in Belleville, Illinois. The training is designed to bring awareness to the dangers of trench cave-ins and how to identify common signs to help avoid these catastrophic trench failures.

MAY 12: A joint meeting of COCA's Board of Directors and Construction Associates was held at the Gateway Center, Collinsville, IL. Our speaker was Ms. Laura Howkins, Partner, Litchfield Cavo, LLP. She discussed an overview of the report generated as a result of the commission research project on Worker's Compensation reform led by Lt. Governor Evelyn Sanguinetti. She also discussed what legislation she felt should change as our government leaders discuss potential reform of the Worker's Compensation laws in Illinois.

JUNE 16: A 4-Person Golf Scramble was held at the Spencer T. Olin Community Golf Course, the Fox Creek Golf Course and Belk Park Golf Course along with a Trap & Skeet Shoot at the Olin Shooting Facilities. These events were held in conjunction with COCA's annual after-hours Burgers and Brats Social held under the pavilion at Spencer T. Olin Golf Course. Owners, Contractors, Labor Leaders, and invited guests had an opportunity to get together in an informal setting to enjoy some food, beverages, and fellowship. The event was attended by over 650 industry leaders and associates.

JULY 21: Our "Contemporary Issues in Construction" summer conference was held at the Gateway Center, Collinsville, IL. The panel of speakers included Mr. David Stoecklin, Executive Director, Madison County Employment and Training; Mr. Don Vichitvongsa, General Manager, SunCoke Energy, Granite City; Dr. Robert Daiber, Madison County Regional Superintendent of Schools and Mr. Ed Choklek, Executive Director, Construction Forum Education Foundation. They spoke about the Industrial Manufacturing Construction Sector facing a growing concern about the shortage of a fully qualified labor workforce. With retirements, decisions to seek other employment opportunities, 'Generation Y' workers deciding to pass up good paying blue collar jobs and the

forecast of increased projects planned, we are deeply concerned where these workers are going to come from.

SEPTEMBER 15: A joint meeting of COCA's Board of Directors and Construction Associates was held at the Gateway Center, Collinsville, IL. Our speaker was Mr. Dan Thompson, Executive Vice President-Plant Operations-Coal, Dynegy Power Generation. He gave an overview of the state of Dynegy Generation in Southern Illinois entitled “Dynegy in a Challenging Market Environment”. He spoke about the recent decision to close the Dynegy – Wood River Power Station as well as the status of the Dynegy – Baldwin and Newton Power Plants. Mr. Thompson outlined a plan to save hundreds of jobs through a common sense approach to changing market conditions. He spoke about how our Government Leaders can help restore a business friendly atmosphere in Southern Illinois.

OCTOBER 20: Our “Contemporary Issues in Construction Safety” fall conference was conducted at the Gateway Center, Collinsville, IL. Our speakers were Mr. John Langford, Corporate Safety Director for James McHugh Construction Company; Mr. Dustin Miller, Compliance Assistant Specialist, U.S. Dept. of Labor, OSHA; Mr. Adam Micun, Vice-President-Midwest, TekSolv, Inc. and Ms. Dianna Braud, CAE, COSS, National Programs Director, Alliance Safety Council. The conference offered an opportunity to hear firsthand from the experts in the field of Safety about the changes occurring in Washington with OSHA and how it could impact your company. We learned the latest information about proposed changes in the Construction Standard and what to expect in the coming months including details about what companies must do to stay in compliance with 29CFR 1926, the Construction Industry Standard.

The remainder of the conference focused on The American Allied Safety Council’s new alliance with OSHA, COCA, TekSolv and the Southwestern Illinois Building and Construction Trades Council. An OSHA Representative explained the support the AASC and the entire construction industry has from OSHA to take safety in the heavy construction sector to the next level through training and education programming provided by the above entities.

Attendees also heard about a new program being offered by the AASC designed to expose key employees in your company to the latest fundamentals in the area of occupational safety. The Certified Occupational Safety Specialist Program (C.O.S.S) is a program that provides an opportunity for employers to equip their employees with the core competencies, including hands-on and face to face learning, to be successful in occupational health and safety in their daily work responsibilities.

DECEMBER 8: A joint meeting of COCA's Board of Directors and Construction Associates was held at Gateway Center, Collinsville, IL. The COCA Owners presents an overview of their upcoming capital construction and major maintenance projects forecasted for 2017. Additionally, they described their current levels of plant operations and employment, and their safety experiences with contractor employees.

COCA MEMBERSHIP

COCA's membership consists of two categories: Owner/User and Construction Associate Members. Our Owner/User members are major industrial and utility firms, which are located in the Southwestern Illinois region. These firms procure significant construction and maintenance services from contractors/companies. Our Construction Associate members include construction companies, design and engineering firms, equipment and material suppliers, and firms which provide other services necessary to insure safe, well-managed, high-quality, cost-effective construction projects in the Owner/User's facilities.

Our members are provided the opportunity to attend quarterly meetings, conferences and safety training programs. They are also encouraged to participate on one or more COCA committees. Our yearly format consists of four quarterly lunch meetings lasting approximately two hours. In addition, we hold training sessions in the spring and fall which consists of either an OSHA 8 Hour or 30 Hour (29CFR 1910) General Industry Safety and Health Training; or an OSHA 10 Hour or 30 Hour (29CFR 1926) Construction Safety & Health programs. We also hold a Trenching & Shoring Competent Person Training session in mid-spring. These training sessions are offered on an "as needed" basis. Formal announcements regarding meetings and conference program topics; and training schedules are sent out a few weeks prior to each event.

Our quarterly meetings are only **open to current members**, but all training sessions and any conferences that are held are open to anyone interested in attending. We encourage our members to invite prospective clients to our quarterly meetings to experience first hand what COCA offers.

Our members also have the opportunity to participate in COCA's Annual Golf and Trap event which is held in the middle of June. This gives our members the opportunity to network and solidify partnerships with their clients and guests while enjoying a fun day.

COCA COMMITTEES

COCA members (Owner/Users and Construction Associates) have the opportunity to volunteer as a member on our various committees which provide insight, information sharing and addresses concerns pertinent to the industrial and construction community.

Contractor Liaison Committee: Consists of Owner/User Representatives. Meetings are held on an “as needed” basis. The committee meets with the various contractor associations to communicate any ideas or concerns before they negotiate labor agreements. This committee also conducts meetings between the Executive Council, Board of Directors, and the Building Trades Council’s officers and business agents.

Golf Committee: Consists of Owner/Users and Construction Associate Members. A pre-meeting is held in April or May. A post-meeting is held after the Golf event. Each committee member is expected to obtain a minimum of three Tee/Hole sponsors and one golf foursome for the event. The Committee is critical in the ultimate success of the golf event.

Legislative & Litigation Committee: Consists of Owner/User Representatives. Meetings are held on an “as needed” basis. This Committee is responsible for keeping abreast of any legislative or legal issues which could directly affect our owners and associate members.

Maintenance, Engineering and Technology Committee: Consists of Owner/User Representatives such as Maintenance, Engineers and Technology Managers who have responsibility to keep the plants maintained and running. Meetings are held quarterly. Committee members share best practices, creative vendor alliances, philosophy, and formal systems approaches to maintenance activities.

Membership Committee: Consists of Owner/User and Construction Associate Members. Meetings are held annually and on an ‘as needed’ basis. The Committee is responsible for and assists with identifying prospective Owner and Contractor Associate members. Potential associate members are those that currently service heavy industry or have the desire and capability to perform that type of work. NOTE: Commercial or residential contractors do not fit the profile COCA established for Associate Membership.

Program/CICE Implementation Committee: Consists of Owner/User and Construction Associate Members. Meetings are held annually. NOTE: CICE is the acronym for Construction Industry Cost Effectiveness. The committee helps with providing program topics for COCA’s quarterly meetings. They are also encouraged to suggest topics throughout the year.

Safety Committee: Consists of Owner/User Representatives such as plant safety managers, engineers, and safety coordinators. Meetings are held quarterly. Committee members discuss topics based on concerns with the responsibility for contractor safety, best practices, contractor pre-qualifications, training and orientation, safety trends, and their specific safety experiences. Guest speakers are frequently asked to attend and provide information on specialized topics of interest

COCA COMMITTEES (cont.)

Safety Council Advisory Board Committee: Consists of Owner/User representatives along with Construction Associate members, OSHA and TekSolv, COCA's partner in training. Meetings are held quarterly to discuss the training needs of the area's heavy industrial workforce. This group is responsible for identifying and implementing new training programs and ensuring existing programs continue to meet the needs of our owners.

Trap Committee: Consists of Owner/User and Construction Associate Members. A pre-meeting is held in April or May. A post-meeting is held after the Trap event. Trap Committee helps with the planning and ongoing management of this event and helps to promote participation and improve the enjoyment and safety for the event. The committee members are encouraged to sign up teams of shooters to ensure a worthwhile event.

Tri Partite Committee: Consists of Owner/User Members, Construction Associate Members and Local Unions. Meetings are held quarterly. The Tri-Partite Committee discusses ways to improve the construction and maintenance processes within the industry in a formal partnership setting.
